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COVID-19 Vaccine

Homebound COVID-19 vaccinations

<u>New referrals</u> are required and there is an emphasis on ensuring clients are truly homebound as staffing resources are limited this year.







COVID-19 Testing

Free rapid antigen tests are available at some <u>locations</u> in Toronto.

Toronto Public Libraries will have free antigen testing kits and local pharmacies may also have some.

Publicly funded PCR or rapid molecular testing are available for <u>selected eligible groups</u>. Refer eligible groups with COVID symptoms to COVID assessment centers and/or <u>testing locations</u>.

COVID-19 Therapeutics

Paxlovid

- Assessment and prescription via primary care and select pharmacies
- Access to COVID-19 antiviral treatment (Paxlovid) | Ontario Health

Remdesivir

- Assessment & prescription via primary care and/or <u>UHN Connected Care Hub</u>
- Referral to closest Home and Community Care and Support Services (HCCSS) branch for administration

Influenza Vaccine

Organizations must apply annually to provide vaccines through the MOH's UIIP unless they receive other publicly funded vaccines (excluding the COVID-19 vaccine).

RSV Vaccine

NACI guidelines are still pending.

Arexvy is publicly funded in Ontario for those 60 years and older living in long-term care homes, Elder Care Lodges, and for some retirement home residents.

Arexvy is available to purchase from community pharmacies with a doctor's prescription.
